BON VOYAGE WITH DANCERS AT SEA!

Departing from Southampton, England on a round-trip journey, these are 14 nights that you'll never forget.

Southampton - Its great location means you've access to a range of historic sites, charming villages and national landmarks. Proximity to London gives easy access to all the major airports. Some highlights of this area are Windsor Castle, the largest and oldest inhabited castle in the world, and Stonehenge, a UNESCO World Heritage Site built over 5 centuries ago.

Porto - Let your inner photographer loose on this city full of great character. Your camera roll will no doubt feature the signature blue and white tiles, Porto's signature ceramics feature perhaps most beautifully in the exteriors of the Carmo and Capela das Almas churches. Also famed for it's many wineries, this is the heart of the "d'Ouro" wine region.

Barcelona - Admire the exterior of the 600-year-old Catalan Gothic Cathedral of Santa Eulalia as you explore the atmospheric Gothic Quarter. Watch the world go by in Plaça Catalunya, the main square, take the Passeig de Gracia to see the city's unfinished masterpiece, the Church of Sagrada Familia.

Cannes – Here on the French Riviera, Cannes is known for its beaches, chic boutiques and elegant nightspots around La Croisette promenade. It was a sleepy harbor until 1834, when Lord Brougham stayed here on his travels to Italy and began its transformation into a fashionable resort. It's now home to the famous film festival and the immortalized handprints of A-list movie stars. Also just a short ride from the famed Nice and Monte Carlo.

Rome - A visit to Rome is a genuinely unforgettable experience. Explore legends throughout the ages, including the Vatican and Michelangelo's Sistine Chapel, the Colosseum, the Roman Forum and the Catacombs. Stroll down the Via Veneto or sip cappuccino in the Piazza di Spagna. Italy's "Eternal City" is endlessly fascinating, So make your wish to return as you throw coins into the Trevi Fountain.

Sardinia - The old port of Alghero has a distinctive Catalan feel that shines through in its old fortification, most notably in the colorful dome and dominant Gothic bell tower of the Church of San Francisco. The legacy of "Little Barcelona" extends to its culinary delights too. Paella features prominently among the charming bars and restaurants you'll find in the maze of charming cobbled streets.

Granada - Malaga is famously Picasso's birthplace, and its location has attracted explorers, merchants and artists from all over the world across the centuries. Many left their mark on this cosmopolitan city. North from Malaga is friendly and vibrant Granada, where you'll find the unique beauty of the Alhambra Palace and Gardens overlooking the city with views across the plains and to the mountains.

Gibraltar – Gibraltar is perhaps best known for The Rock, a 426-feet limestone ridge with sheer drops on its northern and eastern sides. Beyond, Gibraltar's landscape is rural, diverse, and well worth exploring. Ascend by cable car to the top of the Rock Station with views across to Africa.
