Athens, Greece



Rooted in Greek mythology, Athens is alive with stories from civilizations of the past. On a cruise departing from Athens, arrive early to tour the remains of ancient lores — like the Temple of Olympian Zeus and Acropolis — dine at the city's lively tavernas and admire iconic sculptures bathed in natural light within the Acropolis Museum. Explore Greek mythology at the Parthenon and discover the archeological excavations of Pompeii — a lost city and UNESCO World Heritage Site.

Mykonos, Greece

Due to its proximity to the mainland, Mykonos was one of the first Greek islands to become an international travel destination. In the '60s and '70s, Mykonos was famed as a haunt for the rich. The island's nightlife - then and now - was a glittering whirl of colored lights, music, and parties. But there's another side to Mykonos - the neighboring island of Delos. In classical mythology, Delos was the birthplace of Apollo and his twin sister Artemis. Travelers to Delos can stroll among vast ruins, including three temples consecrated to the Sun God and the famed Lions Walk.





Limassol, Cyprus

Limassol offers everything a Mediterranean traveler desires. The second-largest city on Cyprus is surrounded by many historic sites, ranging from the Greco-Roman ruins at Paphos and Curium to Crusader castles.

The Troodos Mountains feature quaint villages, dramatic scenery and cool, dense pine forests. The island's capital of Nicosia is a mere hour's drive from the port. For the casual visitor, Limassol offers its own medieval castle, a superb Public Garden, excellent beaches and that exhilarating Mediterranean light.

Rhodes, Greece

The Colossus may not be standing anymore, but the island of Rhodes still delivers beauty on a giant scale. The island greets you with serene white-sand beaches and wide-open blue skies. Visit the harbor where the now-destroyed wonder of the ancient world once stood. Head to the Old Town, surrounded by medieval walls and ancient gates. See the Palace of the Grandmaster, with mosaic floors dating from Hellenic, Roman and early Christian times. Shop for a menagerie of seashells by the shoreline and relax beside translucent blue waves.





Santorini, Greece

One of the most visited destinations on many Mediterranean cruises, Santorini's multicolored structures pop against the blue-and-white buildings and the turquoise Aegean sea below. After docking in Fira, the capital city, you'll take a small boat to the shoreline and then in picturesque Greek fashion, make your way to the top of the island by either cable car, donkey, or on foot. Explore the village of Oia, see the sunset from Amoudi Bay, or take a half-day excursion to Nea Kameni and Palia Kamenis for a dip in their ancient, therapeutic hot springs.

Crete (Heraklion), Greece

Archaeological evidence shows that Heraklion probably arose during the 9th century B.C. and was named in tribute to the Greek goddess Rhea, mother of Zeus. Like most Mediterranean cities, Heraklion has a long and turbulent history. Officially founded by the Saracens in the 9th century, the Byzantine Empire invaded in 961 only to lose control to the Crusaders who sold Crete to the Venetians in 1211 for a thousand silver coins.





Naples, Italy (for Capri & Pompeii)

Italy's third-largest city, Naples is a bustling metropolis famed for it stately buildings, crowded streets, pizza - and notoriously bad traffic. However, this beautiful city is rich in centuries-old culture and customs. Naples is also your gateway to the Isle of Capri, the fabled Amalfi Coast and the ruins of Pompeii, buried in ash by the cataclysmic eruption of Mt. Vesuvius in 79 A.D. Naples boasts an ideal location, with both the ruins of Roman cities and the stunning Amalfi Coast in easy reach.

Rome (Civitavecchia), Italy

Your gateway to the Eternal City, Civitavecchia has served as Rome's seaport since the 13th century. The port has a long and venerable history. The emperor Trajan built a pleasure villa near the modern city, while Bernini and Michelangelo designed the harbor fortifications.

Yet the Eternal City eternally beckons. The ancient capital of the Western World and the center of Christianity for nearly 2,000 years, Rome provides an inexhaustible feast. Visit the ruins of the Forum, view the splendors of the Sistine Chapel, or climb the Spanish Steps, once the heart of Rome's Bohemian Quarter. Rome has been a magnet luring the world's greatest artists, architects, and philosophers since the days of the Caesars.
