Barcelona, Spain



Barcelona was a hidden gem amidst Europe's diverse landscapes until it was popularized by the 1992 Olympics. Now it's widely recognized for its architectural masterpieces and spirited customs. Leave enough time before you depart to visit Park Güell — a UNESCO World Heritage Site — and feel inspired by the colors and unique artistry that lies in the park and throughout the entire city.

Marseille, France

The largest port on the Mediterranean, Marseille is France's 2nd largest city and a virtual melting pot of peoples and cultures. Dominating the harbor is the infamous Chateau d'If, the rocky prison from which Alexandre Dumas' Count of Monte Cristo escaped. Explore the countryside around Arles and Avignon, immortalized in the canvases of Van Gogh, Cezanne, Matisse and Picasso.



Monte Carlo, Monaco



The tiny principality of Monaco, a sovereign state of just under one square mile, has an outsized resume, boasting some of the planet's most expensive real estate, and the world's most prestigious casino. Amble through the streets of Old Monaco on a guided stroll that winds to Prince's Palace Square. Afterwards, visit Monte Carlo's exotic and fashionable Casino Square.

Florence/Pisa, (Livorno) Italy

Livorno is the gateway to glorious Tuscany. Visit Florence - the cradle of the Renaissance - home to the Duomo, the Uffizi and the Ponte Vecchio. Here the Medici fostered a city-state whose cultural legacy is as great as classical Athens. Giants like Dante, Da Vinci, Michelangelo and Galileo infused the West with a new creative spirit. Then there is Pisa, Florence's rival for political power. Pisa, a brash, commercial seafaring town rivaled the great maritime powers of Venice and Genoa.







Rome (Civitavecchia), Italy

Your gateway to the Eternal City, Civitavecchia has served as Rome's seaport since the 13th century. The port has a long and venerable history. The emperor Trajan built a pleasure villa near the modern city, while Bernini and Michelangelo designed the harbor fortifications.

Yet the Eternal City eternally beckons. The ancient capital of the Western World and the center of Christianity for nearly 2,000 years, Rome provides an inexhaustible feast. Visit the ruins of the Forum, view the splendors of the Sistine Chapel, or climb the Spanish Steps, once the heart of Rome's Bohemian Quarter. Rome has been a magnet luring the world's greatest artists, architects, and philosophers since the days of the Caesars.

Sorrento, Italy

A warming sun and gentle sea breezes have been attracting visitors to Sorrento for two millennia, and its reputation as a playground of the ancient rich and famous have resulted in lavish villas and palaces. Take one of the many excursions available to explore some of the wonderful sights, culture and history around this amazing city.



Catania (Sicily), Italy



Mountainous and rugged, Sicily's highest point is the tip of that infamous and still active Mt. Etna, and as a result Catania is richly layered, having been buried under lava seven times in recorded history. Explore the architectural antiquity of Siracusa's Old Town, Ortigia, with its beautiful Baroque buildings, or spend the day walking through ancient Roman history with a tour of the anthropological marvel of Villa del Casale.

Kotor, Montenegro

One of Europe's best-preserved cities of medieval or Renaissance vintage, Kotor's walls were constructed right into the slopes of the mountain behind it, making it an amazing sight on approach from the sea. Discover the rugged natural beauty, charming local villages and the ancient royal capital of Montenegro on an eye-opening excursion into the Lovcen Mountain Range.
