Papeete, Tahiti



Papeete is the capital of French Polynesia, a group of islands in the South Pacific. Beside the port, busy Place Vai'ete fills with roulottes, or food carts, in the evenings. Nearby, the large Marché de Papeete market sells local produce, fish and handicrafts. The Robert Wan Pearl Museum focuses on the local pearl industry and sells jewelry.

Moorea, Society Islands

Moorea is the stuff of South Pacific Island dreams. Located a short ferry ride from Papeete, Moorea is a small volcanic island encircled by a coral reef and white-sand beaches. Things to do in Moorea revolve around nature, the outdoors, and its indigenous Tahitian culture. Spend a day snorkeling, diving or swimming, then relax over Polynesian–French fusion cuisine in the evening.



Fakarava, Tuamotu Islands



Fakarava is Mother Nature's ultimate sanctuary. This protected coral atoll is a natural reserve for many rare species of birds, plants and crustaceans. Just as these exotic creatures have discovered their safe haven, you too can find refuge here.

Nuku Hiva

Marquesas Islands

This beautiful island is the largest of the Marquesas Islands of French Polynesia. The first people arrived here over 2000 years ago, and later colonized Tahiti, Hawaii, and New Zealand. Its volcanic origins are responsible for the dramatic scenery and vast natural harbor that exist due to the partial collapse of a volcano's caldera.



Bora Bora, Society Islands



The dramatic Mount Otemanu stands watch over the sparkling turquoise waters and sugary sands of Bora Bora, known as the most romantic island in the world. Snorkel, swim with the manta rays or enjoy an outrigger canoe ride through the lagoon and its lovely coral islands.

Raiatea, Society Islands

Raiatea abounds with natural treasures, such as its magnificent lagoon, rocky mountain cliffs and lush, unique vegetation. An ideal destination for lovers of nature and anyone interested in history. Although less famous than its illustrious neighbors Bora Bora and Moorea, Raiatea will surprise and delight you by the strength of its mana and the beauty of its scenery.
