## Edinburgh, Scotland



Like much of Scotland, Edinburgh is a beautiful region shrouded in myth, mystery, and ancient history. Pale stone monuments. Crooked cobbled streets. Views out to the moody Firth of Forth estuary. On a visit to Scotland's bewitching capital, discover a fascinating atmosphere which will leave you wanting more.

## Reykjavik, Iceland

Reykjavik is the capital and largest city of Iceland. Home to 40 percent of Iceland's total population, Reykjavik is a colorful capital city, but not much larger than a small town. Perched on Iceland's rugged coastline, Reykjavik is proud of its natural setting, beautiful architecture and thrilling culture.



## Akureyri, Iceland



Known as the capital of the North, the city of Akureyri offers a majestic setting and the possibility of glimpsing the Northern Lights. Akureyri is nestled at the base of Iceland's longest fjord, Eyjafjörður; a spectacular stretch of water that spans nearly 40 miles. Piercing blue fjords, bubbling mud pools, snow-kissed mountains and tumbling waterfalls all form part of the spellbinding cocktail that is Akureyri's scenery.

## Eyjafjordur, Iceland

Eyjafjordur is a tranquil route to Akureyri, the city that lies at the end of the fjord. Along the way you'll pass a number of smaller towns and villages along the shore. Almost 50 miles in length, Eyjafjordur offers an unforgettable scenic journey that instills a sense of calm. With towering mountains on both sides, including the magnificent Mount Kerling at 5,046 feet, you'll find yourself constantly in awe of the picturesque views.



## Isafjordur, Iceland

Isafjordur is the rugged and remote capital of Iceland's Westfjords region. Home to about 2,600 residents, this historic fishing town sits on a dramatic peninsula surrounded by towering mountains. It is famous for its preserved 18th-century timber houses, fresh seafood, and nearby natural wonders like the Dynjandi waterfall.

## Belfast, NI, NK

Founded in the 19th century, Belfast Harbour is the maritime gateway to the island of Ireland and a world-leading industrial centre that dominates the coastline. Its thriving seaport is a central hub for industry, tourism, and commerce, frequented by travelers worldwide, keen to experience the friendly welcome of Northern Ireland's capital.



## Cork, Ireland



Cobh is a charming seaside town built on a steep hill on the Great Island in Cork's natural harbor. When you cruise to Cobh you berth only 200 yards from the center of town so it's a great place to step off the ship straight into the warm ambience of Ireland. There are countless sights of historical interest and importance, such as the Fota House, Arboretum and Gardens located nearby.

## Southampton, England

Located in the picturesque English county of Hampshire, Southampton is a vibrant waterfront city, serviced by direct trains to London, an airport, and an international cruise terminal. Explore the city's maritime heritage and links to RMS Titanic in the Sea City Museum, see contemporary British art in the Cultural Quarter, or walk the medieval walls in the Old Town, paying a visit to the Tudor House and Garden.
