Passengers can delight in the fabulously British touches of afternoon tea and a formal royal ball in the Queens Room – or enjoy west-end caliber entertainment in the spectacular Royal Court Theatre. Guests even have the option of reserving private box seating with Champagne and sweets for a nominal additional charge. The Queen Elizabeth also has lots of modern features, including a state-of-the-art Computer Centre, relaxing whirlpools and karaoke, for some fun at night. Cunard is also known for its cuisine - we recommend the Lobster Newberg at the Queens Grill and the decadent Cambridge Burnt Cream Tart at the Britannia Restaurant. For relaxation, Queen Elizabeth offers wide open deck space, the Garden Lounge – a large conservatory, based on the famous hothouses of Kew Gardens – as well as a unique Games Deck, where you can try your hand at a game of croquet or paddle tennis in the middle of the ocean. Or if guests prefer, the ship features a two-story library, elegantly finished and appointed with thousands of volumes to peruse.
